PIONEER RESIDENT OF COUNTY
PASSES AWAY

PNEUMONIA BRINGS THE END

Had Been Ill for a Long Time, and
Complication Hastens End; Chil-
dren All at Bedside

Frouke Stellingware, an old resident of New Amsterdam, Wis., died yesterday afternoon at 5:30 from a complication of diseases followed by pneumonia. The deceased was a retired farmer and had lived in this vicinity for 39 years, being well known in La Crosse, where he has a large number of friends and relatives. He was born in Holland and was 76 years old.

Besides a wife he leaves nine children: Mrs. Byron Mulder, Cornelius and Mrs. Bruno Mulder of New Amsterdam; Florus of La Crosse; Mrs. Ezra Brown of Madison, Wis.; Garret of Midway; Jack of Dickinson, N. D.; Mrs. Albert Schlander of Holmen, and Henry of St. Andrews, Wash., all of whom are here.
